It aims to provide a forum for empirical findings, critical reviews, and conceptual papers on the many aspects of nicotine and tobacco, including research from the behavioral, neurobiological, molecular biologic, epidemiological, prevention, and treatment arenas.

Aim to review manuscripts within 30 days, and post accepted manuscripts in 1 week and corrected proofs in 6 weeks

Article types



What to do and not to do...

- DO...check that your manuscript fits the scope of the journal
- DO...read and follow the instructions to authors
- DO...format the manuscript correctly
- DO...prepare a cover letter addressed to the Editor (of N&TR!)
- DO...contact the editorial office if you are unsure about anything
- Do...suggest reviewers

- DON'T...be impatient – the review process can take several weeks

To have a chance of being published, an article should:

- Address an important question
 - Report a well conducted study (where appropriate)
 - Be of wide interest to the international readership of the journal
 - Be clearly and accurately reported – adhere to guidelines
 - Form relevant conclusions that clearly link to the findings
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- We can only publish about one quarter of the submissions we receive, and have to decline some good work!
